Programs Supported by the Foundation

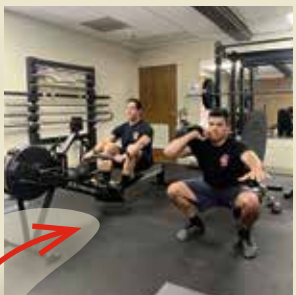
Fresno Fire Explorer Program

The Explorer Program is for young men and women aged 14 - 20. Explorers meet every other Saturday to gain insight into the firefighting profession, develop a strong work ethic, and learn team building.



EMT/Fire Academy Scholarship

This program sponsors up to two (2) underrepresented/minority youth to attend the Fresno City College EMT and/or Fire Academy. All tuition, books, equipment, uniforms, and fees are covered.



Fitness for Firefighters

This program aims to purchase fitness equipment for each of the fire stations to assist firefighters in staying primed and ready to protect themselves and the community from harm.

Youth Fire Safety Education

This hands-on program reaches 1st-3rd grade children with age appropriate fire and life safety education.



Firefighter for a Day

This event provides members of the community an opportunity to tour historical Fire Station 3 and participate in basic fire profession maneuvers.

Champ Camp

This week-long, residential summer camp experience is for child burn survivors ages 5-17.



Arson Dog Shilo

Meet K-9 Shilo! She works alongside the department's arson investigator to utilize her special skill of detecting accelerants. Her job is to sniff out fire scenes to determine if ignitable liquids were used during the ignition of the fire, which could indicate arson as the cause.



Fire Chief Kerri Donis Girls Empowerment Camp

This one-day program is designed to encourage young women (ages 14-18) to consider firefighting as a career. Participants get hands-on training, a day of empowering learning, and an unforgettable exposure to the profession.

"Helmets Are Cool"

This program distributes helmets to children and promotes the lifestyle and concept of "Helmets Are Cool." Helmets are passed out at public education events, from Fire Headquarters, and kept on engines to pass out to children observed riding without a helmet.
